**Remember:**

- **Consent must be affirmative and unambiguous.**
- **Consent can be revoked at any time.**
- **Consent to one sex act does not imply consent to another sex act.**
- **Consent cannot be given by a person who is incapacitated by drugs and/or alcohol.**
- **Consent cannot be obtained by or inferred from:**
  - Coercion;
  - Silence that is not accompanied by conduct evidencing an agreement to engage in a particular sexual act;
  - Consent communicated by the other person on a previous occasion;
  - Consent communicated to another person;
  - The other person's failure to resist physical force (however, the other person's resistance to physical force will be viewed as a clear demonstration that the person has not communicated Consent);
  - The sexual arousal of the other person;
  - A current or previous dating, romantic, intimate, or sexual relationship with the other person;
  - Currently or previously cohabitating with the other person;
  - The other person's attire;
  - The other person's reputation;
  - The other person's giving or acceptance of gifts; or
  - The other person's extension or acceptance of an invitation to go to a private residence, room, or location.

**Below are Some Tips on How to be an Active Bystander:**

- Be aware of your surroundings.
- Be able to recognize when someone needs help.
- See yourself as being part of the solution.
- Educate yourself on what to do when you see that someone needs help.
- Take action but be sure to keep yourself safe.

**How to Intervene Safely:**

- Tell another person – do not try to intervene alone, if possible.
- Ask a victim if he or she is okay.
- Ask the person if he or she wants to leave. Make sure that he or she gets home safely.
- Call the police (911) or someone else in authority or yell for help.
